



Barkway and Nuthampstead Neighbourhood Plan Referendum

Information Statement

A Referendum relating to the adoption of the Barkway and Nuthampstead Neighbourhood Plan will be held on 1 May 2025.

The question which will be asked in the referendum is:

“Do you want North Hertfordshire District Council to use the Neighbourhood Plan for Barkway and Nuthampstead to help it decide planning applications in the Neighbourhood Area?”

The Referendum Area is identical to the area which has been designated as the Barkway and Nuthampstead Neighbourhood Planning Area.

A person is entitled to vote in the Referendum if on 1 May 2025:

- he or she is entitled to vote in a local government election in the Referendum Area;
- his or her qualifying address for the election is the Referendum Area. (A persons qualifying address is, in relation to a person registered in the register of electors, the address in respect of which he or she is entitled to be registered).

The referendum expenses limit that will apply in relation to the Referendum is £2410.44. The number of persons entitled to vote in the Referendum, by reference to which that limit has been calculated is 821.

The Referendum will be conducted in accordance with procedures which are similar to those used a local government election.
